MD 2026 HB 104	Mireku-North	Unhoused Individuals - Rights and Affirmative Defense Companions: SB 49 Establishes that unhoused individuals have certain rights relating to engaging in “life-sustaining activities.” The bill prohibits certain governmental entities, officials, or agents from imposing specified penalties for exercising a right established under the bill or for offering aid to unhoused individuals on or about public places. The bill also authorizes the Attorney General or an individual harmed by a violation of the bill’s provisions to bring a civil action against governmental entities, officials, or agents. Furthermore, the bill establishes an affirmative defense of necessity for certain criminal prosecutions relating to trespass or disturbing the peace. Finally, the bill repeals the authority of a municipality to prohibit vagrancy. The provisions of the bill must supersede any local law or ordinance comparable in subject matter except to the extent that the local law or ordinance provides broader applicability or more protections for unhoused individuals than the bill. The bill has a severability clause. MD 2026 SB 49	Muse	Unhoused Individuals - Rights and Affirmative Defense Companions: HB 104 It creates a set of protected rights for unhoused individuals, including the right to be free from discrimination based on housing status and to engage in life-sustaining activities (like resting, sleeping, eating, or protecting oneself from the elements) in public places, as long as those activities don’t obstruct others or traffic and no adequate indoor alternatives are available. The bill prohibits state and local governments and officials from imposing civil or criminal penalties on unhoused people for exercising these rights or on others who provide them with food or aid. It establishes an affirmative defense of necessity in prosecutions for criminal trespass or disturbing the peace when the conduct occurred while engaging in life-sustaining activities and no adequate alternative indoor space was available. It also repeals municipalities’ authority to prohibit vagrancy in the Local Government Article and provides that the new protections generally supersede comparable local laws unless those local laws offer broader protections.
