The Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) Statewide Innovation Grant (STIG) is a competitive grant program that aims to fund local projects that improve transit reliability, access and connections to key destinations, and increase mobility options.

The program is designed to assist local transit providers and governments plan or implement innovative services or infrastructure improvements that will measurably improve the rider exeperience. A wide array of project types are eligible including design and eginnering, planning and feasibility studies, and construction projects. Highly-competitive projects could include:

- Mobile fare payment systems
- Innovative scheduling software
- Dedicated bus lanes of HOV lanes
- Bus Rapid Transit (BRT)
- Corridor assessments and studies
- Comprehensive routing studies
- Transit signal prioritization and queue jumps
- Comprehensive sign and bus stop upgrade programs
- Mobility hubs and commuter parking amenities
- Vehicle purchases or upgrades to facilitate better mobility

Statewide Transit Innovation Grant awards are an important tool in overcoming barriers to modernization and creating more equitable transit systems. Eligible applicants are encouraged to apply, or contact MDOT MTA with any questions regarding program structure or project eligibility.
